Dear Friends in Christ,

When the Treasure Valley Cluster congregations chose *Created for Community* for our Midweek Lenten Worship Service theme, I was a bit skeptical. I am longing so deeply for community, and wouldn't this theme just magnify that? But as we prepared for Ash Wednesday and as I crafted the *Created for Community with Creation* service (for Feb. 24), I recognized this theme is a great fit. The worship services and devotions on tvprays.org will help us reclaim that word, community, and explore the many and various communities to which we belong. We are created for community with creation. For our service, I dove into my photographs, the Idaho Wildlife and Sightings Facebook Group, and some of my favorite nature writers. I was reminded that the best teachers on this topic encourage us to live with the creation, not simply go there to escape from the engine of our economy. We are created for community with all the saints. Most of us have lost someone we love, and we also have learned about people of deep faith who followed Jesus in decades and centuries past. That is all part of what we mean when we say we believe in the communion of saints. We are created for community with our neighbor. I don't know about you, but I have gotten to know my neighbors in new ways this year. Sometimes that is fun, sometimes not so fun, but they are one of the communities to which I am called as a follower of Jesus. We are created for community with those on the margins. Who are the people on the margins in the Treasure Valley? In your life? How are we in community with those individuals? Finally, we are created for community with Christ. Lent in the early church was a time for baptismal preparation, when that union with Christ is complete and the journey of following Jesus begins. Being united with Christ means being united with both his death and resurrection, which is part of our Easter hope. I am grateful for this Lenten theme, *Created for Community*, and I am grateful to be in community with each of you! Blessed Lent.

Figuring Out How Much Money Goes Into Your Barnyard Box!

How do YOU plan to stuff your barnyard box? Here are some ideas -

- make it into a "CAN'T" jar (like in the commercial) - feed the box each time you say the word "can't".
- make it into a "CUSS" jar - no explanation needed - as you give up certain words for Lent

Flowers- Even though we aren't meeting in person yet, flowers are still desired for the sanctuary. Please bring them to the church office during office hours by Thursday.







