October - National Depression and Mental **Health Screening Month**

I have never written an article like this for a church newsletter, but this seemed like an appropriate time to do so. October is Depression and Mental Health Screening Month. This is personal for me.

I have lived with Clinical Depression since my teenage years. I grew up in a home where such things were not discussed. In High School, when I did ask for help, my mother's response was "we can't take you to see anyone. What if they neighbors found out?" She was more fearful of social stigma than her daughter's mental health. She also never admitted that she too suffered from severe depression because she was fearful of the social stigma.

It wasn't until 1995 and years of therapy that I realized that part of the issue was my brain chemistry was off. That the depression was partly physical and so needed some physical (chemical) intervention. It was then that I went on my first antidepressant medication. I was blown away by the difference. I suddenly realized how other people's brains worked differently from mine. I also found it much easier to be the joy-filled, easy going person that I had been as a young child. Since

then, I have learned the red flags that tell me I need to tweak or change medication. Recently, I experienced some of those red flags and reached out to my Psychiatric N.P. for a tweak in dosage.

When I became a pastor, I decided to be open about my disease to help others who may be suffering in silence. Having depression or another mental illness is not a moral failure or lack of faith issue. You can't just "buck up" and be well. It isn't an issue of "being sad". It is a physical, chemical malfunction in brain chemistry. Talk therapy can be very helpful but ultimately many people need to be treated with medication to bring their brain chemistry back to "normal". Just like diabetics need medication or insulin to bring their bodies back to "normal".

During October, if you or a loved one have been struggling with depression, I encourage you to talk to your doctor, talk to me, or seek out resources online. NAMI Treasure Valley is a good place to start. Please don't just suffer in silence. People who understand are closer than you realize.

September Noisy Offering on Sunday, September 29th is to welcome our new neighbors (teachers & staff) at West Learning Center (WLC). It was West Middle School in

previous years. The Nampa School District reallocated several schools this summer. West Middle School as well as the three at WLC are some of those that were impacted. Our new neighbors are a combination of three schools combined onto one campus. 1) Union High School is Nampa's innovative school that helps students learn through non-traditional methods with an emphasis on individual learning. It's a "Big Picture" approach. 2) Nampa Academy has grades 9-12 where students focus on fewer goals at a time, has flexible days; more individual instruction; more independent work & highly reenforcing. 3) RISE is for students in grades 6-12 who have had disciplinary issues in the traditional schools. At RISE, students can meet their academic as well as behavioral needs. The monies raised from the noisy offering on Sunday September 29th will be used to purchase snacks for the hard working & creative teachers and staff that work at these three schools at the West Learning Center. We want to

welcome them to our neighborhood and thank them for working with our Nampa students!

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE

About 20 years ago a member of the congregation left an endowment gift to protect Trinity from debt default. That gift was invested. An endowment committee was formed to maintain the integrity of the principal and to assure continued earnings from the investment. The principal now includes that original gift plus subsequent contributions and 10% of annual earnings each year. All assets are held under the "Trinity Lutheran Cares Fund." No portion of the income generated by the fund shall be used for the annual operating

budget of the congregation. The growth of the fund has reached the predetermined point where the previous year's annual earnings can be distributed according to an approved formula including but not limited to the following:

Capital improvements to Trinity Lutheran Church, Nampa and it's ministries; Northwest Intermountain Synod of the ELCA.

Suggestions for distributions are encouraged from the congregation. The endowment committee shall recommend distributions to the congregation council, who shall, in turn, upon approval, pass the recommendation on to the congregation at a legally called annual or special meeting of the congregation for a vote.
