Taking the Pulse of Trinity - We Are Doing Well

In August the Stewardship Committee wondered "how are the folks at Trinity Lutheran doing

thirteen months into our pastoral vacancy?" They were initially asking this question while contemplating the fall Stewardship campaign but, after some thought, said, "let's ask this generally. How are we doing? What is going well and what isn't?" So, four cottage meetings were scheduled to allow people an opportunity to voice how they are doing and how they think Trinity is doing. Thirty-two people attended the cottage meetings. Overwhelmingly the comments were positive, upbeat and full of hope. One of the main themes throughout was how Trinity is truly a church of the people. That despite losing a vibrant, involved pastor, the ministries at Trinity, for the most part, didn't miss a beat. Whether it was reaching out to our neighbor school, other non-profits in the community, taking care of our own, or gathering to worship - our members were still actively engaged in ministry here. People said that they love the visitor friendly bulletins, which apparently are also member friendly. Our yearly themes, such as "All Are Welcome," is a great way to focus our attention throughout the year. Visitors are warmly welcomed but not smothered.

Areas of concern sounded much like any other congregation, whether Lutheran or another denomination. How can we keep our young people after they graduate? How can we balance "welcoming all" without it digressing into a perceived political position? How can we encourage more people, children, youth, and adults to participate in Sunday School?

I attended all four cottage meetings to listen and learn. What I heard, and continue to see, is a congregation who knows who it is and what it can do. Although ministry continues happening every day there is also the joyful anticipation of what a new pastor will bring to the mix. in peace,

THE SEASON OF ADVENT BEGINS ON DEC. 1

We will once again be having Wednesday evening Soup Suppers at 6:15 pm followed by worship with Holden Evening Prayer at 7:00 pm. During this service we will burn the ribbons from All Saint's Day in the fire releasing some of our grief into the night sky.
