JOURNEY INTO EASTER

Our Journey through Lent continues from March into April with our journey through the senses in our midweek series taking us into touch and ending with taste at the altar. In the early church Lent was a time of preparation and catechism for

baptism at Easter, walking with study and intention through the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, praying and meditating upon his way, and deciding whether potential converts were ready to take on Christ's death, resurrection and ascension. This year at Trinity we do not have a group going through confirmation or awaiting baptism. Instead, we each take up our own practice and walk the path of Christ this "lent". Through our Lenten Senses series we ground ourselves each week in sensing light, seeing how we each were created in the image of God, hearing the still small voice of calm, smelling oils of blessing, touching the waters of baptism, and tasting the agape feast of Christ. Let us stride with intention into Palm Sunday and the Triduum that, this year, we might let the washing of feet, Christ dying on the Cross, and rising again on the third day resonate in each of our journeys. Let us rise into Easter a resurrection, people, recharged looking forward, again together by our Lenten walks with Jesus.

MARCH NOISY OFFERING on Sunday 3/30/25 will go to SHE Style Her Empowered (the Dress That Grows). The Dress that Grows provides approximately 1,500 girls a year with school uniforms in the country of Togo. The dress can fit a girl for 3 years by adjusting to 6 sizes, allowing them to get an education, \$20.00 pays for one dress, the girls do the sewing, therefore also learning a marketable skill.

APRIL NOISY OFFERING on Sunday 04/27/2025 will be going to Learning Peace Camp for Kids! Peace Camp is a free summer day camp here in Nampa. It is a cooperative camp operated by several churches in Nampa, of which Trinity is a proud founder and supporter. Children aged 6 to 13 vears are welcome as campers and older teenagers and adults are the camp counselors. Campers learn about peace within, quietness and movement. They cultivate joy through music and self-expression through art. During the week they will learn about peace, conflict resolution, interpreting the media, and noncompetitive play. They learn peace with different cultures, learning to get along with others. The campers enjoy connecting with nature through hiking and cooperative team building activities and art. Since

the camp is free for families, Learning Peace relies heavily on donations from the community. A \$25 donation sends a child to camp for a day. Thank you for your continued support.

ANNUAL TRINITY CAMPOUT 2025 - is scheduled for July 25 - 27 at the Ward property near Donnelly. Save the date! Whether you have an RV, tent, or plan to sleep in a hammock - or at your own place in Valley County - or in a local motel - or just plan to drive up for the day......you are welcome to join us for as much of the event as fits your schedule. Each year, people invite friends and family who do not attend Trinity; we love having quests.

LEARNING PEACE: This is a busy time of year for us we are ramping up our fundraising and getting ready for camp.

FUNDRAISING: As you are probably already aware, this month's Noisy Offering benefits Peace Camp. We are also participating in Idaho Gives which is April 28th through May 1st this year. Please consider supporting Learning Peace as we try to raise money for Peace Camp this year. Our goal is to raise \$15,000 to help cover expenses and to send over 100 campers a day to camp. Remember, every donation, small or large, helps.

CAMP: Peace Camp is June 23rd through June 26th this year. Registration for campers and volunteers opens May 5, 2025, the link will be included in the May Epistle. As director of Learning Peace, I would love to see as many of our Trinity kids and teenagers at camp this year.

LOVE OFFERING - Speaking of CAMPOUT, our "love-offering" this year will be similar but different. Similar in that we are showering our love on a library (Donnelly Public Library this time). Differently in that we won't be giving them books. This library has just over 1000 sq ft of floor space and, with the 2024 legislation requiring separation of adults' and children's materials, they have moved their children's programs outdoors into several teepees. They have a robust after school program plus a wonderful summer program planned. When

asked what we could do to support them, the library director said "healthy snacks" would be a godsend!

We hope to help provide snacks for the after school and summer children's programs. We would like to be able to offer snacks that the kids will like but are on the healthier side of things. There are many options to choose from at our local stores whether it's a grocery store, Costco, or a specialty market.

The basic requirements are that the snacks are individually wrapped in a snack size portion, they need to be "shelf stable" (does not require refrigeration) with a "use by" date that extends six or more months. The categories are **Cookies**, **Crackers**, **Chips**, **Fruit**, **Nuts/Seeds**, and **Miscellaneous**. Some healthy ideas are:

fruit snacks or roll-ups made with real fruit or juice instead of gummy bears

popcorn instead of chips

crackers with peanut butter or cheese instead of plain crackers

graham crackers instead of cookies

dried fruit like raisins or cranberries

small portion sizes instead of large bags. Think of things that you might buy for a lunch box.

Boxes to collect the snacks are in the Narthex through April!

Tami Robinson (our nutrition expert) found prices ranging from 25 to 75 cents per individual portion. It depends on what's on sale, different name brands, and the season. It's almost as much fun shopping as doing a scavenger hunt! **HINT** - this is **not** the time to clear your pantry of pudding and applesauce that expired in 2013!!

The library's other need is more floor space; it is raising money to add this space. We will collect a **monetary offering** for the library's building fund at the CampOut worship service on 7/26.

GRATITUDE LENDING LIBRARY - In keeping with our 2025 theme of gratitude, please visit a NEW little library in the narthex bookshelf. We have 5 books on gratitude that we'd love to have you borrow, read, and return. Follow the

instructions on the little clipboard and enjoy! Here's what we have to offer (at the moment - we plan to add more selections as the year continues)....

GRATEFUL by Diana Butler Bass. This book was studied by our Tuesday afternoon group. It covers our individual emotions and ethics around gratitude plus how we as a community can experience gratitude together. Every day there are reasons NOT to feel grateful.....so thoughts and acts of gratitude are a sort of defiance, an alternative to anger and fear. They show hope in the face of evil, and lead to a more abundant experience of living.

I WANT TO THANK YOU (How a Year of Gratitude Can Bring Joy and Meaning in a Disconnected World) by Gina Hamadey. The author challenged herself to write 365 thank-you letters in a year, separating the months into different categories. Follow the humor and grace of her journey and pick up some ideas you could use. If writing notes is not your thing, there are many ways to

MAKING GRATEFUL KIDS (The Science of Building Character) by Jeffrey Froh and Giacomo Bono. This is research-based guidance on ways to instill gratitude early in life. Kind of like a free wonder-drug with zero ill side-effects.

express gratitude.

THANKS A THOUSAND (A Gratitude Journey) by A. J. Jacobs (from TED Books). A simple "thank you" to the barista when he picked up his morning coffee led the author to thank the literally thousands of people who contributed to this coffee......from farmers and shippers and buyers to the guy who invented the lid with the little hole so he could smell the coffee as he drank it, the creator of the jacket that kept him from burning his hand, and the chemist at the reservoir that supplied his city's water. A fun book that expands your mind and makes you grateful for all the people who supply things that we all take for granted.

THE GRATITUDE DIARIES (How a Year Looking on the Bright Side Can Transform Your Life) by Janice Kaplan. Another year-long journey, separated into

seasons and sub-topics, by the former editor of Parade magazine. She shares the stories, successes and short-fallings of her journey, with some very specific guidance including a 7-day gratitude challenge.

PSALMS on Tuesdays from 2:00 pm –
4:00 pm. The Tuesday Study Group has
finished our exploration of other religions

and how Christians can interact and interact with them. On February 11th at 2:00 pm we began our new focus on the psalms. Each participant brings his/her own favorite translation of the Bible (perhaps Vicar Aaron will bring his Hebrew version?!) and we study the different genre of the psalms. It is generally accepted that they group into the following categories: Lament (of the community and of individuals); Specialized Lament (penitential and imprecatory); Thanksgiving (of the community and the individual); Specialized Thanksgiving (salvation history and songs of trust); Hymnic Psalms (hymns and doxologies); Liturgical Psalms for Public Worship (covenant songs, royal/enthronement songs, songs of Zion, and temple liturgies); and Community/Wisdom Psalms. If you have an interest in the psalms, or an interest in a study group - this would be a good time to join us. If your schedule has you out of town frequently, this would be an ideal topic for you - each week's lesson is self-contained, and you won't feel lost if you miss a week or two. Please consider joining us in the Koinonia (blue) room on Tuesdays between 2:00 - 4:00 pm as we trek through the psalms together.
