


CALL TO WORSHIP:

COMMEMORATIONS FOR THE WEEK

Tuesday, April 29, 2025 Catherine of Siena, theologian, died 1380

This theologian was the first woman among Roman Catholics to receive the title "Doctor [teacher] of the Church." Catherine was a Dominican sister known for her mystical visions as well as her work on behalf of people who were poor and imprisoned.

Thursday, May 01, 2025 Philip and James, Apostles

Philip was one of the first disciples of Jesus, and called Nathanael to "come and see." Little is known of James, the son of Alphaeus, called "the Less" to distinguish him from another apostle named James.

Wednesday, April 23, 2025 Athanasius, Bishop of Alexandria, died 373

Best remembered for defending the teaching that Christ was fully God against those who taught otherwise, Athanasius was an influential church leader around the time of the Council of Nicea. He was banished from Alexandria five times for his forthright views.



WORD

God speaks to us in scripture, preaching, and song.

FIRST READING: Acts 5:27-32

Peter has been arrested for proclaiming the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection. His response to the charges of the high priest summarizes the early church's proclamation of forgiveness of sin through repentance.

²⁷ When they had brought [the apostles,] they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, ²⁸ saying, "We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us." ²⁹ But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than any human authority. ³⁰ The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. ³¹ God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. ³² And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

R: The word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

PSALM: Psalm 118:14-29

R: ¹⁴ The Lord is my strength and my song and has become my salvation.

C: ¹⁵ Shouts of rejoicing and salvation echo in the tents of the righteous:

R: "The right hand of the Lord acts valiantly! ¹⁶ The right hand of the Lord is exalted! The right hand of the Lord acts valiantly!"

C: ¹⁷I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord.

All: You are my God, and I will exalt you.

R: ¹⁸ The Lord indeed punished me sorely, but did not hand me over to death.

C: ¹⁹ Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter them and give thanks to the Lord.

R: ²⁰ "This is the gate of the Lord; here the righteous may enter."

C: ²¹ I give thanks to you, for you have answered me and you have become my salvation.

All: You are my God, and I will exalt you.

R: ²² The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.

C: ²³ By the Lord has this been done; it is marvelous in our eyes.

R: ²⁴ This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

C: ²⁵ Hosanna! O Lord, save us! We pray to you, Lord, prosper our days!

All: You are my God, and I will exalt you.

R: ²⁶ Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord; we bless you from the house of the Lord.

C: ²⁷ The Lord is God and has given us light. Form a procession with branches up to the corners of the altar.

R: ²⁸ You are my God, and I will thank you; you are my God, and I will exalt you.

C: ²⁹ Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good; God's mercy endures forever.

All: You are my God, and I will exalt you.

SECOND READING: Revelation 1:4-8

The book of Revelation recounts a mystical vision of the risen Christ experienced by a Christian prophet named John. Here he describes Christ as a timeless redeemer, the beginning, present, and end of all time.

⁴ John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, ⁵ and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood, ⁶ and made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. ⁷ Look! He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be. Amen. ⁸ "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.

R: The word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

Please rise as you are able.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



P: The Holy Gospel according to John, the 20th chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

GOSPEL: John 20:19-31

The unprecedented events of the day of resurrection continue as the risen Jesus appears to his fearful disciples. A week later, after Thomas worships Jesus, Jesus pronounces that the blessings of the resurrection are also for those who "have not seen and yet believe."

¹⁹ When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²² When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." ²⁴ But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." ²⁶ A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." 30 Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. 31 But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.





 now and forever. Amen.


INVITATION TO COMMUNION

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

The night you faced betrayal, Jesus, you offered up Bread for all, thanked your Father: Broke it, and gave it to those you loved, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.

SHARING OF THE PEACE

P: Jesus' first words to the disciples after the resurrection were: "Peace be with you." Even as he showed them his wounds, the evidence of his pain, his words were: "Peace be with you." In the face of their fear, Jesus' words were: "Peace be with you." It is with the Spirit of the Resurrected Christ that we greet one another--even with our pain, with our fear, with our celebration--as we share the peace. Today, I invite you to stand and greet those around you by sharing your name and the words: Peace be with you!

C: Peace be with you!

You may now greet those around you saying "Peace be with you".

You may shake hands, bump elbows, hold up two fingers in the "Peace sign".

Do whichever is comfortable for you.


