DECEMBER NOISY OFFERING

On Sunday the 28th will be going towards assisting the senior citizen program through West Valley Animal Shelter. Many senior citizens are on a limited budget and struggle to pay their heating, power, and other bills in the winter while having enough money to buy food for their pets. Pets are an invaluable part of senior citizens' lives—they provide companionship that most folks would otherwise not have constantly. They are loved and give that love tenfold in return. Monies collected will be used to purchase cat and dog food for these senior citizens. If you prefer, you can purchase cat/dog foods and bring them into the church. Boxes will be in the Narthex for collection. Here are a few guidelines for your donations: All pet foods must be made in the USA; Only 5-10-pound bags (weight lifting restrictions for senior citizens); Small bags of cat litter; Gently used blankets are also needed. Each year, we pause to honor those who lost their lives and those who bravely served in the aftermath. It's a reminder of resilience, sacrifice, and the importance of remembering our history. Let's take a moment or two this month to reflect and carry forward their legacy with gratitude.

STEWARDSHIP

The Bob Torrey version. When I joined Trinity Lutheran in 2011, I came with a notion of "biblical stewardship" formed through my experiences at a variety of churches and with a variety of people who called themselves Christians. At Trinity, I was delighted to find a man called Bob Torrey, a church

leader who had an amazing approach to stewardship. As a recipient of a lung transplant, Bob exuded an irrepressible gratefulness for the gift of life and a joy in pursuing whatever God had planned for him in the days that followed. When asked about stewardship, Bob's response was, "stewardship is everything that happens after I say 'yes' to God". How a Christian acts reflects on God. It is making our large and small decisions with God in the discussion. It's something that comes up literally dozens of times each day, in questions like, "what will people think of Jesus if I do and "how will all the moments of my life bring glory to the holy name of my Savior?" and "what exceptional thing can God empower me to do with His help?" Being with Bob was like watching WWJD (what would Jesus do?) in action! What a privilege to learn about stewardship from Bob and work with him on the Stewardship Team.

This is the time of year when committees start talking about budgets and we ask church members to commit to specific personal stewardship in the upcoming year (by volunteering our time, talents and financial treasures). It is tempting for churches to shift from a biblical concept of stewardship into an American corporate approach; accompanied by the wringing of hands and pleas for money to pay salaries and mortgages and utilities -- but largely ignoring the premise that Jesus' reason for the existence for "churches" has little to do with buildings and staff and much to do with ministries and acting like "Jesus with skin" in our world. Yes, there are financial realities that must be acknowledged, but the early church accomplished miraculous ministries and church growth without mortgages or utilities and with no paid staff. So, it is crucial to always keep "ministry" in mind and never forget that we can accomplish nothing without God's help and we can accomplish miracles with His help. (Penelope Smith)

TUESDAY STUDY GROUP PSALMS on Tuesdays from 2:00 pm - 4:00 pm. Since February 11th this group has been focusing on Psalms.


Each participant brings his/her own favorite translation of the Bible (perhaps Vicar Aaron will bring his Hebrew version?!) and we study the different genre of the psalms. It is generally accepted that they group into the following categories: Lament (of the community and of individuals); Specialized Lament (penitential and imprecatory); Thanksgiving (of the community and the individual); Specialized Thanksgiving (salvation history and songs of trust); Hymnic Psalms (hymns and doxologies); Liturgical Psalms for Public Worship (covenant songs, royal/enthronement songs, songs of Zion, and temple liturgies); and Community/Wisdom Psalms. If you have an interest in the psalms, or an interest in a study group - this would be a good time to join us. If your schedule has you out of town frequently, this would be an ideal topic for you - each week's lesson is selfcontained, and you won't feel lost if you miss a week or two. Please consider joining us in the Koinonia (blue) room on Tuesdays between 2:00 -4:00 pm as we trek through the psalms together.
